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Concept of Course Evaluation

Goals

- assessment of course perception
- suggestions for further improvement of the course
- dialogue between students' and instructors' perspective

Data Collection and Analyses

- The questionnaire assesses effect variables (overall impressions, acquired qualifications,...) as well as process variables of the course (instructor's behavior, contribution of participants,...).
- All aspects of evaluation are phrased in a precisely observable and performance-oriented way.
- The visualisation of the data contains the following elements:
 - the distribution of responses in percent on a 5-point rating scala and the mean of the students
 - comparative figures (if available) of the institute/faculty and/or of the university (based on the students' assessements of other classes).








Behaviour of the Lecturer I

Behaviour of the Lecturer II










